Just to clarify, the ringing at Ashwell was purely a test ring. The handling is not very good and there is still a lot of work required to the frame and fittings.

More ringing is not recommended at the present time, with plans for further renovation work ongoing.

Bells rung again

On February 12, 2022 the Ashwell Bells were rung again – see [Bell Board](#) for details. This was the first ringing recorded since 1976!

The ring of 5 bells at Ashwell dates from the early 18th century; it was increased to 6 in 1850 by the addition of a new Treble weighing 3cwt 3qr 25lb by the Whitechapel foundry, which was hung over the previous Treble (now the second) in an extension to the existing frame - see picture. The whole project cost £26 0s 8d.

Louis Totaro and Brian Farr have been working on the bells, with the guidance of Simon Adams from Taylors, to assess whether the un-ringable tag is correct. Quoting from *Time in Rutland*, "The bells at Ashwell Church have not been used for full-circle ringing since the 1970s owing to the condition of the frame, and a defect in the tower structure."

After quite a bit of time spent inspecting and titivating, it was deemed that a test ring was possible, and so we may soon hear this lovely ring sound again in the village. Thanks to Louis, Brian and Simon for their hard work and persistence.



Note however, that the bells are still under monitoring and repair, and not available yet for general ringing.

The Tower Correspondent is Louis Totaro. He will be able to provide further information as renovations progress.

HOW TO PAY YOUR SUBS / DONATIONS BY BANK TRANSFER

As we make progress back to normality and looking forward to a more normal year of ringing, I would request that members pay their subscriptions and/or donations as soon as possible by bank transfer, to save the collection and handling of cash.

A reminder : the Guild rule number 2 states that members over the age of 75 need not pay the subscription of £7, but any money they do pay will be classed as a donation (D see below)

Any excess over £7 paid by a member under 75 will also be classed as a donation.

(if an error says the payee doesn't match, please just press the button to accept the difference)

REFERENCE BOX : YOUR NAME & TOWER & S (or D or J)

This last bit advises me whether your money is a subscription (S) or donation (D) based on age, or student status (J), see above.

A brief email would be helpful, to say that it has been done, with a note on whether I can apply for Gift Aid on your payment until further notice. I can also check email details on my member register.

I trust this is all self-explanatory, but feel free to contact me.
