Ringing for the Coronation

With 34 towers in our County of Rutland it was a feat of organization and communication to ensure that some ringing took place in all towers over the weekend of the Coronation. 36 performances were recorded on Bellboard. Huge congratulations to Sharon Bromilow and Alan Ellis for all the admin undertaken behind the scenes, for the tower captains and tower teams who rang over the Coronation weekend, and for all the recent learners who achieved a level of ringing to be able to join in to demonstrate to friends and family what it is they have been learning. It appears 122 ringers contributed to the ringing in Rutland, with 27 new trainees being able to participate also. Well done all the teachers.

For the 14 or 15 still being taught keep going and we will arrange more rounds and call change practices to allow some concentrated time with you surrounded by good ringers – that way you can feel the rhythm and find the balance every time.

Mary Poyner of Whissendine rang for the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth 11 in 1953. In 2023 for King Charles 111, she chimed the three clock bells sited in their garden, recalling events of 70 years ago.

In celebration of the Coronation of King Charles 111 and Queen Camilla, two peals were rung in Rutland. At Seaton and at Ryhall. Three Quarter Peals were recorded: Uppingham; Braunston and Ryhall. These gave opportunities for several "Firsts" to be attempted and achieved. Thomas Saunders of Uppingham completed his first Quarter Peal as conductor.

Progressing ringing skills and methods

For those who want to learn how to ring methods and ringers wanting to progress their ringing there are in the programme a series of practices (generally during the week) with one aimed at learning or improving doubles ringing (on 5 with tenor behind), another focussing on minor ringing (plain bob, Little Bob, St. Clements and Stedman doubles), and the 3rd focussing on Surprise ringing and treble bob on treble.

Coronation Ringing

We have ringing at 199 towers and featuring over 900 people. That's almost three quarters of the towers in the diocese. Excellent effort by all concerned. The ringers at St Mary's Peterborough, Great Oxenden & Rothwell each rang and named a new method to mark the occasion.

In the 13 peals and 27 quarters there were a number of notable achievements. At Nassington and Gt Oakley the first peals since augmentation were rung and at Aynho the first peal in the tower since 1955 was rung.
