We look forward to seeing all those interested in progressing. You need to start somewhere, and where better than studying the plain course blue lines and see the patterns and rules.

#### This months 8 Bell Branch meeting will be at Oakham on Tuesday 18th July.

The aim is for all those interested at all levels to get rope time and develop rope-sight on 8 bells. All are invited as ringing on 7 or 8 (whilst a progression on ringing 5 or 6 bells) does require practice even if only rounds and plain hunt. The methods to be practiced will be Plain Bob Triples and PB Major also Plain Hunt and Call Changes. As we develop Stedman Doubles (The Cottesmore practices) and Grandsire Doubles (Great Casterton practices) we look forward to ringing Stedman and Grandsire Triples later in the year. No reason not to ring Little Bob Major as many mastered Minor at Cottesmore.

This was a most enjoyable Branch progression practice when ringers from around Rutland met to ring Minor methods and Stedman. For some it was the first time to ring the focus methods and there were lots of smiles of achievement. Everyone had a go and everyone achieved something from the evening. The next Minor/Stedman practice at Cottesmore will be on 4<sup>th</sup> October however if there are ringers who cannot wait that long then why not arrange a Minor practice in your tower and invite all others from Rutland (giving sufficient notice) to swell the numbers.

The methods rung at Cottesmore in June were: Plain Bob Minor
St. Clements Bob Minor
Stedman Doubles
Little Bob Minor

#### **Quarter Peals**

Ringing a quarter peal (about 45 minutes continuous) is a great way to progress and gain in confidence. Your first (and most memorable) might be either ringing the tenor behind or trebling to a doubles method with a good band.

As there are many ringers who have recently "learned the ropes" the next stage in your journey will be to work out how to Plain Hunt and once comfortable with this ropesight, ring a QP on the treble. When completed the elation is such a wonderful feeling. All those interested should approach their tower captains, teachers or any committee member and ask if they can be considered for a QP. Please just ask. It is easier if you feel you are ready.

She was a regular Sunday Service ringer over many years and, even when she couldn't ring any more for health reasons, she would still come up to the belfry every Sunday.

She made many friends in the ringing fraternity and will be greatly missed in the Rutland Branch and beyond.
