We are always welcome to ring, whatever our level, and at least once a year (usually for the Sunday evensong service honouring all the good work done in Rutland) we assemble en masse to ring 12 bells at our "mother cathedral". The Tower Captain always makes us welcome and all level of ringer descend from the tower a different person. So we are delighted, as members of the Peterborough Guild, to announce there is a brand new Guild Badge available for only £5.00. It is a similar size to the Coronation badge as shown on the attached photograph (note: the Scottish Association badge is only available for the Scots). Rutland Branch has some PDG badges so if you would like to buy one (£5.00) please contact Sue Webster, Alan Wordie or Simon Forster, and we can plan to meet and exchange badge for sterling!

Finally, or is that secondly, we thank all those from the Guild who help us when needed – whether for teaching, providing a solid base of ringers around a trainee, or as has been the case to fill a vacancy for a Wedding. Thank you (PRO) for arranging a new run of Guild badges. Which reminds me if there are towers looking for polo shirts, sweat-shirts or T shirts with your tower embroidered on the garment, this can easily be arranged through the Guild PRO who has negotiated some very competitive rates for high quality shirts.

# Chairman's Comments.

Whilst reviewing the new members who have moved from trainees to members (full and junior) I should say how proud of you all we are for your perseverance in learning to ring. Rutland Branch committee are now planning some extra training sessions to help you through advanced bell handling, call changes to kaleido-scope ringing and ringing plain hunt (by places not just remembering a coursing order). Over the last 12 months there have been 22 new members in the Rutland Branch. Well done. There are another 20 or so still looking to "pass the competency test" and so become members. Another few months and most of you will achieve this.

Your committee is planning a series of "rounds to kaleidoscope to plain hunt" sessions to help all new ringers develop their skills - which will cover theory and practical ringing. Watch this space......

## Keep the date.

We are planning to have a Saturday tour on 30<sup>th</sup> September (so please keep the day free).

## SAFEGUARDING TRAINING EXPECTATIONS OF BELL-RINGERS/TOWER CAPTAINS

As church officers, all tower captains should have undertaken on line safeguarding training to Foundation level, formerly module C1. Those Bell-ringers who are involved in teaching children and young people should also complete safeguarding training to foundation level.

These courses should be renewed every 3 years. Those bell ringers who have no responsibility for teaching or are not tower captains are not expected to undertake training but **may** wish to undertake basic training to improve their knowledge of safeguarding. Some tower captains, who have a more significant impact on the safeguarding culture of the church community will need to complete face to face Leadership training with the Diocese of Peterborough.

# ASHWELL BELLS

#### The removal

The last few weeks have seen frenzied activity at St Mary's Ashwell, preparing and removing the peal of bells for their refurbishment and rehang.

Initially a long Sunday afternoon was spent removing the facade of the tower, to allow for better access. Unfortunately, there was no 'ikea' manual to determine how the facade was put together as the fixings were well hidden behind lots of panelling, but we managed to remove just enough to do the job. Three days were spent in the company of churchwarden, Brian Farr, two local helps from the village and the bellhanger, Paul Mason, to commence the removal.

I had previously spent a day in the belfry with Simon Adams from Taylors to remove the bell wheels, clappers, ironmongery, pulley boxes and sliders. What should've taken two days took one as we both know our way around a frame or 2!

So, the main work began. The tower masonry was cut to home 4 steel 'shoes', to place the 6 lifting timbers above the frame and lock them into position.

They say bellringing can be hard on the arms....you have no idea! In using lifting equipment for every tool, beam and part, in and out of the tower I discovered new arm muscles to add to my ringing ones! So myself and Paul set about a day installing the beams and a day lifting the bells out - 5, 6, 4, 1, 2 and 3 in order. With some gentle encouragement the bells came out freely and placed at the bottom of the tower.

Next was the problematical frame for the Treble, which we discovered was never pegged properly into the lower frame by Whitechapel in 1850, due to poor access in the corners. Iron support straps were installed instead to 'push' the frame into the tower corner, but this was always going to have some movement. Apart from one bolt to be cut, all the wooden pegs, tenons and smithied bolts came out freely, which was an interesting sight anyway.

The final morning was spent moving the bells out into the churchyard and lifting through the lychgate onto the flatbed lorry, fortunately this bit of the operation went really smoothly. All that remained to do was the tidying up of our mess and cutting some temporary beams for the hatch. The floor shows signs of wood-worm and at one stage my foot went through it!

It was an emotional end to see the bells travel away from the church back to the foundry, but can't wait for their return!
