Interested in becoming a Bellringing Teacher?



Training and support for bellringing teachers and ringers

A course on learning how to teach bellhandling and how to support new ringers is being planned with the Association of Ringing Teachers (ART).

It will be held in Uppingham, utilising the Church Hall and the Ringing Chamber for theory and practical sessions, on Saturday 27th January. 2024. The course will run all day, 9.15 to 5pm.

Rutland Branch has 4 potential teachers keen to join the course. There are 8 or 10 places available, we do have some existing teachers as mentors (who join the course to understand the ART methods) who will take up a few of the places. This leaves another 3 or 4 slots for anyone who would like to join the course (M1) and go on afterwards to teach at their tower or in a group as and when local ringers wish to learn the art of bellringing.


