Quarter Peal at every tower in Rutland

There is no obligation for any individual, but SHOULD THEY WISH, every member of the branch has the opportunity to participate in a Quarter Peal.

It is for Towers to decide on a date that suits them. It might be to coincide with a special event, or just when their ringers feel ready.

New, inexperienced ringers may feel that they would like to have a go later on in the year. Support can be given between now and then to build confidence and achieve this significant step in their ringing experience.

This is a great opportunity for those who have recently learned to ring bells, to ring a QP either plain hunt on the treble, tenor behind or inside with bobs etc. There is time to achieve during the year, but volunteering early will help those polishing your skills to be able to ring and help achieve the Rutland aim.

If you are interested then please tell your Tower Captain, or one of the contacts below, so you can receive the correct training to be able to reach this milestone moment. Willing volunteers welcomed.

There are alternative options for ringers who do not feel ready for a Quarter Peal.

It might be more favourable to ring 100 changes for the 100th anniversary. There is an achievable option for <u>everyone who wants to take part at any level.</u> No-one is excluded, it is for ALL.

Mary Poyner

We report the death of Mary Poyner on Friday 26th January. Mary was a life-long bellringer of hand and tower bells. She taught many new ringers and rang many peals. During the lockdowns of the covid pandemic she and her husband, Harry, rang several quarter peals on hand bells, in their garden of their home in Whissendine.

She rang for the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth 11 in 1953. In 2023 for the Coronation of King Charles 111, she chimed the three clock bells sited in their garden, recalling events of 70 years previous.

Her funeral will be 12 noon on Tuesday 13th February at Whissendine Church.
