May – the tower open day across the Guild. Organisation for this is well underway with the three individual towers in each branch and individuals in each branch preparing to steward those towers.

July – another big event! A chance for Guild members to converge at Stanwick Lakes country park where there is a superb play area for children, an assault course and many pleasant walks. Near the Visitor Centre we have booked a prominent site in which we will set up the Maplestead mini-ring of eight bells and the Guild Wombell. We hope that these will be a popular attraction and encourage members of the public to come along and find out more about what we do. It is possible that the BBC may cover the event as a news item.

We would like to offer the Rutland Branch an hour slot from 13:00-14:00 in which they can have exclusive use of the mini-ring – an opportunity to ring a quarter perhaps or give some members a novel ringing experience (each bell only weighs about 4kg). We are also looking for individuals who would be willing to supervise members of the public having a go at ringing with the Wombell or on handbells. They were due at the AGM in January and a huge thank you to the many who paid electronically and promptly so far. Thank you also to those who have set the electronic payment to be a standing order every January. At least we cannot forget the sub payment by this route.

So you can make the payment direct to The Branch bank please follow the following process:

- 1. Go into your own (electronic) bank where you can set up Rutland Branch as a payee. [This can then be used every year]
- 2. Bank details are:
 - a. HSBC Business account
 - b. Name PDGCBR Rutland
 - c. Sort code 40-43-05
 - d. Account 31507540
 - e. Reference Your name and tower.
- 3. Note you may need to ensure your bank is aware this is a proper Business Account there have been a few cases where the account has not been recognised, and if you are confident you have correctly typed In the Payee name, if there is a "warning message" you should be able to accept it.
- 4. The sub is £7.00 or £3.50 for junior members. To avoid the need for further fundraising could members kindly donate a little more than the sub, for which a huge thank you.
- 5. Donations from those over 75 are welcomed to benefit recruitment, training and bells in Rutland and the Diocese.

It is very important all members have paid their 2024 subscription by the end of April 2024 so the account can be reconciled before the Branch Treasurer looks to transfer the bank account to a bank where bank charges are NOT charged.

St Dunstan is known as the Patron Saint of Bellringers due to his experimentation in early forging of bells in the 900'sCE. His feast day is 19th May, but in this year that coincides with Pentecost. Instead this year Bell Sunday is on Sunday 12th May. It is hoped the day will raise awareness, emphasise the importance of the sound of bells in our communities.



The 6th of June 2024 marks the 80th anniversary of D-Day, when Allied forces mounted the largest amphibious invasion the world has ever witnessed.

In 1944 Operation Overlord saw over 5,000 ships and landing craft set down more than 130,000 troops on five Normandy beaches in an action that would bring about the liberation of north-west Europe.

As part of the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings, CCCBR are once again encouraging ringers to Ring Out for Peace on 6th June at 6.30pm (or at a suitable time that day).

Rutland Plain Hunt breakthrough courses

A WhatsApp group has been created for all those who have recently learned bell handling, are now comfortable with rounds and call changes and ready to progress to Plain Hunting. Some of you have been travelling around towers and the Tower Captains have been very supportive of your desire to move forward.

Some towers arrange Plain Hunt practices and some do not have sufficient ringers to surround a ringer who is new to Plain Hunting. Ideally an experienced band will ring around the PH ringer so giving a stability of tempo which allows the learner to feel the speeds, see the ropes and have a good chance of success.

So we are arranging one theory session and 3 open bell practice sessions over the next few weeks.
