Bells for St George's Ypres

In 2017 a new set of 8 change ringing bells were cast at the bell foundry of John Taylor & Co of Loughborough. The bells were destined to be hung in a new frame in St. George's Memorial Church Ypres, close to the Menin Gate.

A target sum of £195,000 was needed for casting of the bells and their subsequent transportation to Belgium, The fundraising was a resounding success.



Rutland bellringers had their own target, to raise £647 to reflect the 647 soldiers who fell in WW1, as identified and recognised by 'Rutland Remembers'. This sum was achieved with fundraising and donations from Rutland bellringers.

On 29th July 2017 Taylor's of Loughborough held an Open Day, an interesting and informative day which included seeing the casting of new bells. But, the highlight of the day was seeing the new Ypres bells on display before commencing their journey to Belgium.

Rutland Branch members visit Taylor's of Loughborough



On Wednesday the 19^{th of} February, several members of the Rutland Branch took a trip to Loughborough to visit the Bell Foundry, Workshops and Museum. We all met up with our guides at the Museum before viewing a short film on the history of Taylors, then taking a detailed tour around the site, examining Bells and associated hardware at various stages of (dis)repair! The details of the task being undertaken were explained as we went along, including carpentry, for Stays, pulley blocks, sliders etc; metalwork for the headstocks and frames, and casting for the bells and the larger structural elements of the frames. We didn't actually see any casting being done – maybe next time.

One fascinating area was the tuning workshop, where we saw a few sets of bells in progress. Those with perfect pitch were able to distinguish the quality of the work - not me though!

We didn't see any ropes being made, as that is on a separate site.

One highlight was seeing the Greetham bells on the workshop floor ready for their refurbishment, having been removed from the Tower in mid-January.

A last visit to the education room for a cuppa (those who could find a cup ...) and a second short film, then we finished off with a short ring on their internal Tower - with some very light bells, a fitting end to a great visit.
